

# **NON-PIVOTAL DISCRETIONARY GRANT** 2024/25 FUNDING WINDOW

SME DG, ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME, INFORMAL TRADERS AND MICRO ENTERPRISES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (ITAMED), REGISTERED CO-OPERATIVES PROJECT AND NGOS/NPOS/CBOS PROJECT

The W&RSETA hereby invites applications from qualifying companies as per Application Criteria indicated in the table below for participation in the 2024/25 Non-PIVOTAL Discretionary Grant funding opportunity.

The interventions available for funding, and related eligibility criteria, are listed below.

### INTERVENTION

#### SME **DISCRETIONARY GRANT**

Purpose:

To support Small and Micro Enterprises (companies with less than 50 employees) to participate in skills development interventions.

SME DG Funding for intervention is divided into (3) categories three (Category A, B & Applicants are advised to adhere to application criteria for each category applied for.

#### RATES:

Category A: Funding is to the value of R9 500,00 per SME and is to be utilised solely for training/skills development SME of employees.

Category B: Funding is to the value of R9 500,00 per participating SME to be utilised as follows:

- R3 000 allocated for training of SMEs on a minimum of 2 training modules:
- R5 500 allocated as **Business Support Grant** for purchase stock or business equipment as per the identified needs of each participating SME;
- R500,00 allocated management and delivery fee to contracted SDPs/ TVETs/HETs.

Category C: Funding is to the value of R9 000,00 per SME and is to be utilised for training of SME employees to the value of R3 500,00 and business support capped at R5 500,00 for the purchase of stock business equipment.

#### **TARGET**

3 000 registered small and micro companies operating in the Wholesale and Retail Sector.

The project will be implemented by all W&RSETA Provincial Offices within their regions with each Provincial Office targeting 300 SMEs to participate in the intervention.

#### **APPLICATION AND ALLOCATION CRITERIA**

Only applications received on or before the closing date will be considered.

Application for funding under SME DG Category A will be open to Holding Companies, W&R Employers, Franchisors, Business Associations and organisations implementing small business support programmes.

Applications for SME DG Category B will be open to W&RSETA accredited Skills Development Providers or Skills Development Providers with scope to train W&RSETA programmes/ TVET Colleges/ HET institutions that would apply for DG SME Funding Window on behalf of the SME's.

Applications for SME DG Category C will be open to individual SMEs applying in their own capacity as SMEs.

#### **MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS**

ALL Applications for SME DG Categories A, B & C to include the following:

- Signed Agreement with identified SMEs on the W&RSETA SLA template (Category A and B only);
- Signed Agreement with identified accredited Skills Development Providers on the W&RSETA template (Category C only);
- · Implementation Plan for the Project with details of the training programmes and start and end dates;
- Bank Letter confirming banking details of the applicant that is not older than one month.
- Accreditation Information for the applicant viz:

#### i) Category A:

- Proof of registration to the Holding Company/ Franchisor/ Business Association for each SME applied for.
- Proof of enrolment/acceptance for the SME for participation in Applicant's accelerator / incubator programme
- · List of SMEs that have been recruited to participate in the intervention (SME DG Category A and B only).

### ii) Category B:

- · Proof of Accreditation of the SPD/TVET/HET with
- List of SMEs that have been recruited to participate in the intervention (SME DG Category A and B only).

### ii) Category C:

- CIPC documents
  - Fully completed and signed Small Business Skills Development and Support DG Application Form.
  - Recruited Companies must be small companies (<50 employees) operating in the Wholesale and Retail Sector
  - Recruited SMEs to have a W&RSETA linked SDL number/ N-number to participate. Companies without SDL, X or N numbers will be required to complete and submit the Non-Levy Paying Entity Registration form indicating their retail activities; thereafter an N Number will be created for them.
  - · Only SMEs that are currently registered with CIPC to be recruited for participation.
- 1.6 Allocation will only be made to Applicants that meet the criteria indicated above.

### Method of Application:

- All applications must be made online through the W&RSETA Management Information System (MIS) using an SDL number to access the system.
- Stakeholders must consult the relevant provincial office (where applicant is based) for assistance with access to the system where needed.

## Allocation process:

- Allocations will be approved on the MIS by the W&RSETA.
- Applicants must accept the allocations awarded on the MIS.
- Award Letters will be issued to successful applicants upon acceptance of the allocations.

- The W&RSETA reserves the right to issue an award after this date should allocations be declined or not taken up.
- Award Letters must be signed and loaded on the MIS by the applicants within 5 working days.
- All learners for whom funding is awarded, must be registered by the W&RSETA on the MIS by 30 September 2024. Failure to register learners within the stipulated timelines will result in the re-allocation of funding awarded.

### **Application Deadline:**

Applications will close at midnight on **30 August 2024**. No late applications will be considered.
