1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1. To report on the Implementation of the Supply Chain Management Policy, for the 4th Quarter, i.e., 01 April - 30 June 2024 of the 2023/24 procurement year.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. The Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, No. 56 of 2003, requires the Municipality to have and implement a Supply Chain Management Policy, which gives effect to the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 11 of the Act that deals with 'Supply Chain Management'.
- 2.2. On May 30, 2005, the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations were promulgated. Council, on December 14, 2005, at a legally constituted Council meeting approved the Bitou Municipality Supply Chain Management Policy in terms of these Regulations. The SCM Policy have been reviewed regularly with the last review approved on 31 May 2021.
- 2.3. Section 117 of the MFMA prohibits a Councillor from being a member of a bid committee or any other committee evaluating or approving quotations or tenders. The SCM Policy requires per Section 6 that Council have an oversight role to ensure that the Accounting Officer implements all supply chain management activities in accordance with the SCM Regulations and the Bitou Local Municipality Supply Chain Management Policy (SCM Policy).
- 2.4. Section 6(3) of the SCM Policy requires that the Accounting Officer submit a quarterly report on the implementation of the Supply Chain Management Policy to the Executive Mayor.
- 2.5. The report contains information about operational activities within the Supply Chain Management Division and includes references of Tenders and Formal Written Price Quotations Awarded, as well as Deviations from the SCM Policy, considered and approved by the delegated officials for the 4th Quarter of the 2023/24 procurement year.

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3. Supply Chain Management Unit

In line with Section 7 of the Council's Approved Supply Chain Management Policy, the Accounting Officer must establish a Supply Chain Management Unit to implement the referred Policy. The Supply Chain Management Unit operates under the direct administrative charge of the Chief Financial Officer, supervised by the Manager: Supply Chain Management, and the Unit's operations led by both the Head: Acquisition, Contract and Compliance, and the Head: Demand, Logistics and Disposal Management, to whom this duty has been subdelegated in terms of Section 82 of the Act. However, both the posts of the Head: Acquisition, Contract and Compliance, and the Head: Demand, Logistics and Disposal Management are vacant. The SCM Unit has approached the Human Resource Management Division to advertise the posts externally, seeing that they are both T13 positions. We are anticipating for the posts to be permanently filled by the 01st of September 2024.

4. Tenders Awarded: Competitive Bidding for all Contracts valued more than R 300 000

The competitive bidding process and bid committee structures are functioning effectively. The Bid Committees are composed of the following members:

1.	Bid Specification Committee - BSC	The appointments of Chairpersons and Committee Members, the Project Managers and a Senior SCM Practitioner, are in line with Sec 27 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, consider tender specifications, and recommend to the Accounting Officer for approval.
2.	Bid Evaluation Committee - BEC	The appointment of Chairpersons and Committee Members, the Project Managers and a Senior SCM Practitioner, was in line with Sec 28 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, considers tender evaluation reports and make recommendations to the BAC.
3.	Bid Adjudication Committee - BAC	In line with Sec 29 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, at least four (04) Senior Managers (with the CFO being the Chairperson), and Senior SCM Practitioner (not the same BEC SCM Practitioner) consider recommendations from the BEC and make awards below R10m. However, if an award is above R10m, the BEC recommends such an award to the Accounting Officer to award.

- 4.1. Members of the bid committees are required to declare to undertake the following:
 - 4.1.1. That all information, documentation, and decisions regarding any matter before the committee is confidential and undertakes not to make known anything in this regard.
 - 4.1.2. To treat all service providers and potential service providers equitably and will not purposefully favour or prejudice anybody; and
 - 4.1.3. To make known details of any private or business interest he or she or any close family member, partner or associate may have in any proposed procurement or disposal of, or in any award or contract that they will immediately withdraw from participating in any matter whatsoever.

4.2. The members of the bid committees have duly undertaken to uphold the confidentiality, to be fair in all dealings and to declare their personal interests, if any. None of the members had conflicts of interest to declare.

5. Tender Awards

- 5.1. <u>Awards below R10m</u>: The tender awards made for the Q4 period are valued at approximately **R37 683 891,99** (VAT Incl.). There were ten (**10**) Tenders awarded by duly delegated Bid Adjudication Committees. The referred awards were valued for more than R300 000 but less than R10 million.

6. Tenders - Procurement Process Timeline

The performance of the SCM Unit is measured by the turn-around time on its procurement processes. This can either be on a target of 30 days for a regular tender process, with a 14-day advertisement period or 45 days for a tender advertised for a period of 30 days. 8.2. The applications for deviations are continuously monitored to reduce the incidents and competitive bidding processes are instituted immediately upon identification of recurring deviations, wherever possible.

8.3. Supply Chain Management Bid Committees

8.3.1 **Bid Specification Committee**

The **Bid Specification Committee (BSC)** had scheduled **eleven (11)** meetings for the 4th Quarter of the 2023/24 procurement year. The Bid Specification Committee makes use of the Demand Management Plan as a strategic procurement tool.

Even though the SCM Unit has experienced challenges relating to the timeous receiving of specifications from the project managers, there has, however, been a huge improvement on the side of project managers in this regard. This also assisted the SCM Unit to improve on the turnaround time toward the implementation of the Demand Management Plan 2023/24.

For Quarter 4, the Supply Chain Management Unit processed its procurement requests in line with the Bitou Annual Procurement Plan 2023/24. The said Bitou Annual Procurement Plan emanates from the approved municipal budget. As part of the effectiveness of the SCM Unit, the Unit has introduced monthly reports in line with the Annual Procurement Plan, and submitted to the Municipal Manager, through the Office of the Chief Financial Officer.

Credit needs to be given to the Project Managers for the improvement toward the compilation of Bid Specifications. The SCM Unit has noted with exhilaration the timeous completion of tender specifications at the BSC Meetings. The latter connotes that the rate of back referrals of tender specifications from BSC to Project Managers, or the delays within the BSC processes due to the quality of tender specifications has reduced substantially. If such a reduction could be carried out or extended into the 2024/25 procurement year and beyond, the municipality would experience a trajectory performance on both the Capital and Grant Expenditure.

8.3.2 **Bid Evaluation Committees**

For the Quarter 4, the **Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC)** has scheduled **ten (10)** meetings. However, there have been fewer delays experienced due to the non-availability of the members, which resulted to meetings being re-convened. Furthermore, there were also fewer back referral of items to Project Managers due to clarity being required on technical matters. One other reason for the delays has been as a result of the delayed submission of functionality evaluation reports by the Project Managers/Technical Evaluation Committees (TECs).

8.3.2.1 Technical Evaluation Committee

Section 7(1)(2) & (3) of the SCM Policy requires that a Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) be appointed and implementation as approved in the Supply Chain Management Policy, for ease of reference the policy prescript is quoted verbatim below:

27. Bid evaluation committees

- 1) The SCM Unit must convene a technical evaluation committee, where,
 - a) The value of the tender for goods and services exceeds the amount of R2 million (excluding VAT),
 - b) The value of the tender for infrastructure exceeds the amount of R2,5 million (excluding VAT),
- 2) The committee must be composed of the Chairperson, at least three members, an SCM Practitioner and the relevant Project Manager.
- 3) The Committee must work through the entire tenders' specifications to assess the bidders' ability to rendering service or delivering goods to the municipality.

To provide context on the past processes followed, where bids were issued to project managers to evaluate and draft reports on by themselves or gather officials to assist in the finalization on a draft report to serve at the BEC, which proved the process to be fragmented, not time based, and time consuming. It can also be attested that in the previous financial year, the TEC system was in an adaptation phase. This has afforded an opportunity for Bitou officials, with the necessary skills, to collaborate with each tender, and compile evaluation technical reports for the submission to the Bid Committee Committees. It needs to be mentioned that the TEC is a part of the BEC, and not a stand alone committee.

It cannot be denied that the overall implementation of the Demand Management Plan 2023 / 24 had some challenges. Some of the referred challenges have included, among others,

- Non-attendance of delegated Chairpersons and officials,
- Reluctance of Project Managers to fully participate in sittings.

With that in mind, the TEC in Bitou had demonstrated sheer segregation of duties in the evaluation process of bids. As a key control in the evaluation of bids, the introduction and implementation of TECs in Bitou was intending to minimize the occurrence of errors or fraud by ensuring that no members of the evaluation committee has the ability to both perpetrate and conceal errors or fraud in the normal course of their duties. Cognizance to be taken that the municipality has registered only two (2) ongoing Appeals, looking into the number of awards made in the entire 2023 / 24 Procurement Year. Without any shadow of a doubt, one can argue that the controls applied around the bid committee system of Bitou has improved tremendously over the years. However, more still needs to be attended to.

8.3.3 **Bid Adjudication Committees.**

For the Quarter 4, the **Bid Adjudication Committee** (**BAC**) had scheduled eight (8) meetings.

For the 2023 / 24 Procurement Year, the municipality has pride itself with the independence of the BAC to the BEC. The Bitou Municipality's procurement system has always been characterized by the compliance to five principles of good governance, which are: (1) fairness, (2) equity, (3) transparency, (4) competitiveness and (5) cost effectiveness. The municipality's BAC has always been an integral part of such characteristics.

The awarding of tenders in the current procurement year has sheerly demonstrated that the bids' awarding process of the municipality contained a composed system of accountability. The said process has also ensured that an effort existed to integrate procurement into a more strategic view of Council's efforts to relentless service delivery and scintillating local economic development. The recording of the two (2) appeals by the municipality serves as a demonstration of senior management's tutelage procurement processes free of fraud and corruption.

8.4 Irregular, Fruitless and Wasteful Expenditure.

8.4.1 **SCM Regulations 2023**

For the 2023/24 Procurement Year, the municipality has incurred the Irregular Expenditure amounting to R1 868 534.58 between the period of 01 July 2023 and 28 February 2024.

On 13 November 2023, the Auditor-General SA (AGSA) issued Bitou Municipality with a ComAF Number 13 relating to procurements below the value of R30 000 per transaction. It should be noted that this was a universal finding, which was issued to about sixteen (16) municipalities in the Western Cape.

In the referred finding, the AGSA indicated that during the municipality's audit on Supply Chain Management, it was observed that the preferential points system was not applied to written quotations below R30 000 (VAT included) incurred from 16 January 2023. There was then a dispute or argument between the sixteen (16) affected municipalities, where the WC Provincial Treasury had to intervene. A meeting was initiated by WC Provincial Treasury, Office of the Auditor-General in the WC as well as the 16 affected WC municipalities (the delegation of the municipalities was headed by Breede-Valley Municipality).

During the meeting, it was resolved that each municipality should investigate the full population of formal quotes below R30 000 as occurred between 16 January and 30 June 2023,

as well as between 01 July 2023 and 30 June 2024. The municipalities were to quantify the procurement amounts that were not in complaint to PPR 2022. Such amounts were to be disclosed as Irregular Expenditure in the municipality's Annual Financial Statements. Subsequently, the National Treasury issued a Preferential Procurement Regulations 2023 on 14 December 2023 to set a tone on the procurement thresholds below R50 million, that being the value R2 001 up to R50 million.

From the Regulation 2023, it would then be expected of all municipalities to be complaint with PPR2023 with effect from 01 March 2024. Furthermore, the AGSA in their 2023/24 financial audit would also focus on the implementation of PPR2023, where it would be expected for Bitou Municipality to submit all the necessary information substantiating to such compliance. The municipality would also be expected to submit to AGSA, a substantive proof that Council has refereed the Irregular Expenditure under discussion to MPAC for investigation, and/or Council has written-off such an expenditure.

For the expenditure of R1 868 534.58, the SCM Unit will submit a report to MPAC for investigation.

8.4.2 Potential Irregular Expenditure per Irregular Expenditure Register 2023 / 24

For 2023 / 24 Procurement Year, the municipality has recorded Five (5) transactions to the amount of R121 612 as Potential Irregular Expenditure.

9 SCM Bid Committee Training: 26 & 27 JUNE 2024

The SCM Manager received budget of R90 000.00 and sourced a suitably qualified and experienced service provider to provide Bid Committee Training to SCM officials and officials serving on the Bid Specification, Evaluation Committees and user departments. The budget allowed for 30 officials to attend, and a wider audience was invited to ensure target is met and funds are adequately spent.

Due to MMCL training, unavoidable work commitments and pre-arranged vacation leaves, only 20 officials could attend. It was pleasing on the part of the Project Manager (Mr. Maredi) and the facilitator to experience the informed debates and questions raised and believe this training will strengthen the understanding and synergy between the SCM Unit and user-departments during the 2024 / 25 procurement year.

The primary objectives of the training were:

- ✓ To ensure that officials identify and adhere to the procedures for advertising bids.
- ✓ To fully understand functions of bid committees
- ✓ To understand critical issues to consider when developing specification.
- ✓ To understand critical issues to consider when evaluating bids.
- ✓ To understand critical issues to consider when awarding bids.
- ✓ To link the bidding process to the latest case laws occurred between the organs of state and bidders.

The learning outcomes of the training were to ensure that the participants are able to:

- ✓ Understand the elements of the Supply Chain Management model with public service that applies to the bid committee system to establish the Supply Chain Management context.
- ✓ Understand the regulatory framework that governs Supply Chain Management within the public service to demonstrate an understanding of how each legislation and/or prescript regulates the decision making of bid committees.
- ✓ Know the ethical conduct for Supply Chain Management practitioners within the public service and how this impact on bid committee member behaviour.
- ✓ Compile tender documentation and bid invitation for a specific commodity, according to SCM Regulations, PPPFA and other regulatory framework in order to ensure that the process is fair, cost effective, competitive, transparent, and equitable.
- ✓ Evaluate bids and compile a written submission to the Bid Adjudication Committee recommending the award of the bid to a provider according to bid specification criteria to ensure fames and compliance and ensure that value for money is attained.
- ✓ Consider for the adjudication of bids, the written submissions from Evaluation Committee for fairness, correctness, and compliance against predetermined bid criteria or for the drawing up of a resolution to the relevant authorities for the award of the bid to a provider.
- ✓ Certificate of accreditation/attendance will be required on all delegates that attended the training.
