### 1. <u>PURPOSE OF THE REPORT</u>

1.1. To report on the Implementation of the Supply Chain Management Policy, for the 1st Quarter, i.e., 01 July to 30 September 2024 of the 2024/25 procurement year.

### 2. BACKGROUND

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- 2.1. The Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, No. 56 of 2003, requires the Municipality to have and implement a Supply Chain Management Policy, which gives effect to the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 11 of the Act that deals with 'Supply Chain Management'.
- 2.2. On May 30, 2005, the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations were promulgated. Council, on December 14, 2005, at a legally constituted Council meeting approved the Bitou Municipality Supply Chain Management Policy in terms of these Regulations. The SCM Policy have been reviewed regularly with the last review approved on 01 June 2024.
- 2.3. Section 117 of the MFMA prohibits a Councillor from being a member of a bid committee or any other committee evaluating or approving quotations or tenders. The SCM Policy requires per Section 6 that Council have an oversight role to ensure that the Accounting Officer implements all supply chain management activities in accordance with the SCM Regulations and the Bitou Local Municipality Supply Chain Management Policy (SCM Policy).
- 2.4. Section 6(3) of the SCM Policy requires that the Accounting Officer submit a quarterly report on the implementation of the Supply Chain Management Policy to the Executive Mayor.
- 2.5. The report contains information about operational activities within the Supply Chain Management Division and includes references of Tenders and Formal Written Price Quotations Awarded, as well as Deviations from the SCM Policy, considered and approved by the delegated officials for the 1st Quarter of the 2024/25 procurement year.

### 3. Supply Chain Management Unit

In line with Section 7 of the Council's Approved Supply Chain Management Policy, the Accounting Officer must establish a Supply Chain Management Unit to implement the referred Policy. The Supply Chain Management Unit operates under the direct administrative charge of the Chief Financial Officer, supervised by the Manager: Supply Chain Management, and the Unit's operations led by both the Head: Acquisition, Bids, Contracts and Compliance Management, and the Head: Acquisition, Demand, Logistics and Disposal Management, to whom this duty has been sub-delegated in terms of Section 82 of the Act. However, both the posts of the Head: Acquisition, Bids, Contracts and Compliance Management, and the Head: Acquisition, Demand, Logistics and Disposal Management are vacant. The said post are currently advertised. We are anticipating both posts to be permanently filled by the 1st of December 2024.

# 4. Tenders Awarded: Competitive Bidding for all Contracts valued more than R 300 000 (VAT Incl.)

The competitive bidding process and bid committee structures are functioning effectively. The Bid Committees are composed of the following members:

1.	Bid Specification Committee - BSC	The appointments of Chairpersons and Committee Members, the Project Managers and a Senior SCM Practitioner, are in line with Sec 27 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, consider tender specifications, and recommend to the Accounting Officer for approval.
2.	Bid Evaluation Committee - BEC	The appointment of Chairpersons and Committee Members, the Project Managers and a Senior SCM Practitioner, was in line with Sec 28 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, considers tender evaluation reports and make recommendations to the BAC.
3.	Bid Adjudication Committee - BAC	In line with Sec 29 of the Bitou Supply Chain Management Policy, at least four (04) Senior Managers (with the CFO being the Chairperson), and Senior SCM Practitioner (not the same BEC SCM Practitioner) consider recommendations from the BEC and make awards below R10m. However, if an award is above R10m, the BEC recommends such an award to the Accounting Officer to award.

- 4.1. Members of the bid committees are required to declare to undertake the following:
  - 4.1.1. That all information, documentation, and decisions regarding any matter before the committee is confidential and undertakes not to make known anything in this regard.
  - 4.1.2. To treat all service providers and potential service providers equitably and will not purposefully favour or prejudice anybody; and
  - 4.1.3. To make known details of any private or business interest he or she or any close family member, partner or associate may have in any proposed procurement or disposal of, or in any award or contract that they will immediately withdraw from participating in any matter whatsoever.

4.2. The members of the bid committees have duly undertaken to uphold the confidentiality, to be fair in all dealings and to declare their personal interests, if any. None of the members had conflicts of interest to declare.

### 5. Tender Awards

- 5.1. <u>Awards below R10m</u>: The tender awards made for the Q1 period are valued at **R14 296 574,94** (VAT Incl.). There were five (5) Tenders awarded by duly delegated Bid Adjudication Committees. The referred awards were valued for more than R300 000 but less than R10 million.
- 5.2. <u>Awards above R10m</u>: The tender awards made for the Q1 period are valued at **R119 167 414,51** (VAT Incl.). There were **five** (5) Tenders awarded by duly delegated Accounting Officer. The referred awards are quantified as follows: -

5.5. The Constitutional Court Ruling, by Judge J. Mhlantla that was delivered on 16 February 2023 had made it unlawful for 30% subcontracting to be made a compulsory prerequisite during tender submissions. The Court had argued that subcontracting should be removed as there could be possibility that 70% of the subcontractors' work could be sub-contracted to fully white-owned EMEs and QSEs, where of course, if a tenderer does not subcontract, the subcontractors may be limited. The National Treasury had also issued a communication on the matter on hand, for the municipalities in South Africa to amend their Supply Chain Management Policies.

Identification of preference point system, designated sector, pre-qualification criteria, objective criteria, and subcontracting.

3 (b) (b) determine whether pre-qualification criteria are applicable to the tender as envisaged in regulation 4;

## Pre-qualification criteria for preferential procurement

4.(1) If an organ of state decides to apply for pre-qualifying criteria to advance certain designated groups, that organ of state must advertise the tender with a specific tendering condition that only one or more of the following tenderers may respond-

(a) a tenderer having a stipulated minimum B-BBEE status level of contributor;

*(b) an EME or QSE;* 

(c) a tenderer subcontracting a minimum of 30% to

(i) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people;

(ii) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are youth;

(iii) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are women;

(*iv*) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people with disabilities;

(v) an EME or QSE which is 51% owned by black people living in rural or underdeveloped areas or townships.

(vi) a cooperative which is at least 51% owned by black people;

(vii) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are military veterans;

(viii) an EME or QSE

(viii) an EME or QSE.

(2) A tender that fails to meet any pre-qualifying criteria stipulated in the tender documents is an unacceptable tender.

### Subcontracting as condition of tender

9.(1) If feasible to subcontract for a contact above R30 million, an organ of state must apply subcontracting to advance designated groups.

(2) If an organ of state applies subcontracting as contemplated in sub regulation

(1) the organ of state must advertise the tender with a specific tendering condition that the successful tenderer must subcontract with a specific tendering condition that the successful tenderer must subcontract a minimum of 30% of the value of the contract to-

(a) an EME or QSE;

(b) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people;

(c) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are youth;

(d) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are women;

(e) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people with disabilities;

(f) an EME or QSE which is 51% owned by black people living in rural or underdeveloped areas or townships;

(g) a cooperative which is at least 51% owned by black people;

(*h*) an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people who are military veterans; or

(i) more that one of the categories referred to in paragraphs (a) to (h).

(3) The organ of state must make available the list of all suppliers registered on a database approved by the National Treasury to provide the required goods or services in the respect of the applicable designated groups mentioned in sub regulation (2) from which the tenderer must select a supplier.

All tenders were opened in public, and the results of the opening were recorded in a Bid Opening Register and placed on the Municipal Website as per Section 21(a) of the Municipal Systems Act. A schedule attached as (**Annexure A: Comparative Tender Schedule**), details the tenders opened and awarded versus the unsuccessful competitive bids as per additional Council oversight request.

### 6. **Tenders - Procurement Process Timeline**

The performance of the SCM Unit is measured by the turn-around time on its procurement processes. This can either be on a target of 30 days for a regular tender process, with a 14-day advertisement period or 45 days for a tender advertised for a period of 30 days. A schedule is attached as (**Annexure B**) indicating the timelines for a full procurement cycle underlying each tender award, in terms of the following criteria:

The 2024 / 25 procurement year commenced with *con spirito*, where all the referred twelve (12) Bid Specification Committee Meetings were well attended. Furthermore, the quality of the bid specifications has continued to rise sharply in the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2024 / 25 procurement year. Credit must be given to the Bitou Managers and Project Managers to work as a unit to improve the municipality's tender specification. This has also reduced the number of back-referrals of bid specifications, from the BSC to Project Managers, due to quality or completeness of documents.

## 8.3.2 Bid Evaluation Committees

For Quarter 1, the **Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC)** has scheduled **eight (8)** meetings. However, there have been fewer delays experienced in completing the evaluation of tenders due to capacity constraints in the Supply Chain Management Unit. Only 1 person is in charge of performing compliance checks, the evaluation of tenders, as well as the submission of reports to the Bid Adjudication Committee. In the event where the referred person is not available, the evaluation processes halts. The municipality needs to consider acquiring the services of the second person to assist with the evaluation of tenders.

## 8.3.2.1 Technical Evaluation Committee

Section 7(1)(2) & (3) of the SCM Policy requires that a Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) be appointed and implementation as approved in the Supply Chain Management Policy, for ease of reference the policy prescript is quoted verbatim below:

### 27. Bid evaluation committees

- 1) The SCM Unit must convene a technical evaluation committee, where,
  - *a)* The value of the tender for goods and services exceeds the amount of R2 million (excluding VAT),
  - *b)* The value of the tender for infrastructure exceeds the amount of R2,5 million (excluding VAT),
- 2) The committee must be composed of the Chairperson, at least three members, an SCM Practitioner and the relevant Project Manager.
- *3)* The Committee must work through the entire tenders' specifications to assess the bidders' ability to rendering service or delivering goods to the municipality.

The decision of the Council of Bitou Municipality, to adopt the concept of Technical Evaluation Committee in tenders, will forever be applauded. The TECs of Bitou Municipality have continued to provide neutral and unbiased technical evaluation of tenders. This has assisted the municipality to continue with the evaluation and the award of tenders without any appeals.
